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UPDATE: April 1, 2020

Dear EUSD Families,

I hope you are spending quality time together during spring break. I wanted to follow up with all of you after Governor Newsom's press conference today. I recognize timely information is important during a crisis situation such as this. He discussed the importance of upholding our civic duty to ensure social distancing and remaining at home as much as possible in order to help our state flatten the curve of positive cases that are expected to rise substantially in the coming weeks. The Governor reiterated that he felt California schools should remain physically closed and schools should be prepared to continue instruction via distance learning through the end of the school year.

In my update on Sunday, I shared that we would not be returning to school until further notice and that we are prepared for distance learning beginning April 13 for all children for as long as needed to ensure the safety, health and well-being of our students. We will continue to focus on learning and supporting our students and families throughout this closure. While this is disheartening to imagine the possibility of not being able to return in person this year, we are confident that we have the ability to stay connected with a focus on our collective well-being and the education of our students in order to bring the school year to a positive close in June. Please know should conditions change and should our local public health department deem it safe to reopen school campuses prior to the end of the school year, we will be prepared to do so.

While we recognize this situation poses challenges and hardship to many families, the most effective way to slow and disrupt the transmission of this pandemic – and therefore get back to normal -- is by continuing to implement social distancing practices. We are grateful to our community for everything you are doing during this unique and difficult time.
