

AUTISM / BEHAVIOR SPECIALIST TEACHER ON SPECIAL ASSISGNMENT (TOSA)

DEFINITION

Supervise the development and implementation of educational programs for students with Autism. Coordinate and oversee the ABA programs for students in a variety of settings: Preschool, regular and special education classes. Supervise, train and monitor paraprofessional teams to ensure student success. Collaborate with IEP teams and assist in the development of goals and objectives based on observation, assessment data and parent input. Ensure effective programming for students by observing, analyzing data and modifying curriculum and instructional strategies on a weekly basis. Conduct student progress meetings with parents, instructional assistants and IEP team members. Perform related duties as assigned.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

- Conduct ongoing training for regular and special education teachers, paraprofessionals regarding best practices for educating students with autism.
- Assist general education teachers, special education support staff and school site teams with developing daily reports, behavioral schedules, social skills and curriculum for special needs students in general and special education classrooms.
- Model teaching strategies and techniques for regular and special education teachers and support staff for students with autism.
- Provide consultation and support for parents of students with autism in general and special education classroom and help to facilitate positive collaboration between parents and school site teams.
- Confer frequently with district special education support staff and administrators to provide needed services regarding best practices for educating students with autism.
- · Attend IEP's, staffing, and student progress meetings of students with autism.
- Conduct student progress meetings with parents, paraprofessionals, and IEP team members.
- Conduct Functional Analysis Assessments.
- Provide ongoing training to teachers and paraprofessionals in Applied Behavior Analysis and various methodologies.
- Inform staff of current trends/research in Autism Spectrum and Related Disorders.
- Provide parents with information regarding the nature of Autism and strategies for skill generalization into the home and community.
- Present an ongoing series of trainings regarding Autism Spectrum and Related Disorders on a district-wide basis.
