

Teacher on Special Assignment (ToSA) - Farm Lab Job Description

DEFINITION: Under the direction of the Coordinator of Innovation and Farm Lab Development oversees all aspects of educational, farming, and logistics for K-6 student visits.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Implements project based learning experiences using the DREAMS Model (Design, Research, Engineering, Art, Math and Science).
- Assists with the development, enhancement, and selection of content for K-6 sustainability and agroecology based educational programming.
- Serves as a district resource by modeling best practices to build student agency and engagement for visiting educators.
- Ensures access and equitable participation opportunities for all visiting students.
- Ensures all visits are well curated, comprehensively implemented, and allow for student choice.
- Supports ongoing program improvement and expansion.
- Assists Farm Lab Site Enrichment Teachers (SET) in preparation and pacing for on-site instruction.
- Assists with district curriculum mapping of California Environmental Principles and Concepts (EP&Cs).
- Collaborates weekly with the site coordinator and instructional team.
- Ensures updated instructional units and visit information are available on PowerSchool.
- Maintains and utilizes educational raised beds to enhance learning opportunities (planting).
- Oversees all the related procedural responsibilities for student visits, such as but not limited to, master calendar, scheduling of site visits, permission slips, and surveys.
- Implements and maintains all safety protocols.
- Performs other related duties as assigned.
